According to Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO), works eligible for protection are;

- literary works
- musical work
- artistic works
- films
- sound recordings
- broadcasts

derivative works

Moreover, copyright is also a moral issue. Taking someone else's work without permission of course, is an act of immorality.

So, from now on, respect the owner of the original work. Ask permission. it is prudent to respect the copyrights as well as the respective owners.

The bottom line is downloading books, novels, literature, songs and videos is a clear copyright infringement, it is indeed a serious digital crime.

In summary, copyright issues such as protection of intellectual property, in forms of creative expression through multimedia production, poses challenges for multimedia developers.
